Special Olympics Britain's National Summer Games is the country largest multi-sport event for athletes with intellectual (learning) disabilities. This flag ship event is held every 4 years and represents a huge opportunity to showcase the abilities of children and adults with this type of disability, allowing them to compete at a national level, experience the personal achievements this brings, as well as enable them to make friends, travel and socialise.

About The Games:

- Around 2,600 athletes with intellectual disabilities of all ages and abilities will come together from across the country to compete in 19 sports.
- Athletes will be supported over 4 days of competition by 800 coaches, 750 volunteers, 150 officials and over 5,000 family and friends.
- A spectacular Olympic-style Opening Ceremony to kick-off the event at Sheffield United FC.
